Notice Regarding Extension of Licenses

The Governor issued an **Executive Order** requiring State licensing authorities to extend the renewal deadline for licenses expiring during the State of Emergency Disaster Declaration, if the licenses were in good standing on March 12, 2020. The extension lasts until 90 days after the State of Disaster Emergency ends. Licenses that were current and valid on March 12, 2020 will remain valid until the extension expires. The deadlines for CE requirements are also extended until 90 days after the end of the State of Disaster Emergency.

The Commission will not apply any late, delinquent, penalty, or expiration fees to renewals that meet the requirements above. Fees and penalties will be applied for licenses covered by the Order that are not renewed within the extension period, for licenses that expire after the State of Emergency Disaster ends and are not renewed within the standard deadlines, and for licenses that expired before March 12, 2020 and were not renewed within the standard deadlines.

Kansas Required Core Reminder

Effective July 1, 2020 all licensees are required to complete 12 hours of CE every two years consisting of at least three mandatory hours titled "Kansas Required Core" and nine elective hours.

The Kansas Required Core replaces the "salesperson/broker core." After the effective date, an existing "salesperson/broker core" completed before July 1 transfers to the Kansas Required Core. An existing "broker core" completed before July 1 will transfer to elective credit. Schools have until January 1, 2021 to implement the **new outline**.

Brokers who renew after July 1, 2020 will not need to complete the "broker core," only the Kansas Required Core and elective hours.

Guide to Advertising Changes

Forms and Business Process Updates

Electronic Service Consent. Complete and submit the Consent to Electronic Service form in the [Forms Library](#) if you prefer to have all communications from KREC sent via email. You can also opt-in during online license renewal.

Licenses must be renewed every two years. Check expiration date [here](#).

Name/Contact Change. Login to [MyLicense E-Gov](#) to change your name or contact information and print a new pocket card from the E-Gov Licensing Home Page once the change is submitted.

Salesperson/Broker Pre-License Checklist. Please direct new salesperson and broker applicants to the checklists located in the [Salesperson Requirements](#) and [Broker Requirements](#) sections of the KREC website. These checklists will help navigate the process of obtaining a salesperson or broker license. The [Approved Pre-license Education directory](#) is now located within the checklists.

License History Certification. Login to [MyLicense E-Gov](#) to request that KREC certify your Kansas real estate license history. This is usually required to apply for a real estate license in another state. Detailed records for license history are not provided prior to July 1, 2001.
